A/11/68757, Unit 1 Hedge End Retail Park, Charles Watts Way. Display of one illuminated fascia sign and two non-illuminated fascia signs, four non-illuminated panels, one entrance sign (non-illuminated), one non-illuminated sign attached to existing flagpole plinth and four flags. **Resolved: Objection. Proliferation of advertising and far too many signs and flags for one site. The Committee also consider the use of illuminated signs unnecessary.**
