AS MOST people enjoyed the unusually warm weather over the Summer, the council was considering its programme of events for the Autumn/Winter and thinking ahead to the upcoming Town Council Elections in May 2023.

We've already seen some amazing events in Hedge End this year including Unwrapped which was a day of performances and street artists, The Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations and the 100th Carnival which involved extra days and exceptional attendance.

The Council is conscious of the increasing financial pressures residents are facing and aims to make events open to all, providing free activities for people. During the Summer, the Youth Team provided multi sports games and activities and as a council we have supported the ever-successful Park Sports initiative. Dowd's Farm Junior Park Run continues to attract good numbers each week.

It's worth noting that none of these events could take place without volunteers. If you know anyone who freely gives their time to help others, then why not consider nominating them for our Serving the Community Award (page 5).

I also made reference in the first paragraph to the upcoming Town Council Elections next May. Ahead of that date, the Council has taken a decision to ask Eastleigh Borough Council to review the boundaries of the Town Council wards. This does not affect the boundaries between Hedge End and other parishes. The process is underway and you can get involved by visiting [www.eastleigh.gov.uk/hedgeendcgr](http://www.eastleigh.gov.uk/hedgeendcgr) The changes proposed provide a more equal balance of councillors to electors, so they are better able to represent residents.

As the area has grown, what people identify with has also changed and the proposed ward name changes hopefully reflect this. Each ward will have several councillors, unlike the present wards that may be served by only one councillor. We live in a democratic society where you can get involved.

## Play Area Upgrade this Autumn

### NORMAN RODAWAY PLAY AREA

CHILDREN will soon be able to enjoy a new, exciting play space in Hedge End when the Norman Rodaway Play Area is refurbished this Autumn.

The revamped play area will be extended to include 11 items of play equipment, plus brand new safety surfacing, seating and bins.

The fencing will be replaced with a new modern design and there will be additional entry gates.

Based on the consultation feedback earlier in the year, the Town Council will be adding toddler and junior swings, a new slide, a four-way seesaw, rockers, a toddler multiplay, a spinning dish and hula. Four of the existing play items are being kept. The new play area is being designed by Sutcliffe Play, who also built the playground in Greta Park.

Cllr. Paul Carnell said "I'm delighted that the Town Council has been able to refurbish the play area, whilst retaining some of the existing equipment. I used to bring my children here to play many years ago and I'm so pleased that future generations will get to enjoy it too."

The Town Council would like to thank everyone who took part in the consultation in the Spring.

## PLANT A TREE FOR THE JUBILEE

THE QUEEN'S Green Canopy is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee, which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

The Chair of the Council, Cllr. Cliff Morris will soon be planting a commemorative tree at the St John's Recreation Ground. The Town Council will also be inviting the community to join us in planting more than 450 saplings of native trees - hawthorn, dogwood, wild cherry, silver birch, hazel, rowan, blackthorn and sessile oak - at Dowd's Farm in the Autumn. These have been donated by the Woodland Trust as part of the Queen's Green Canopy initiative.

Cllr. Cliff Morris said "I am delighted that Hedge End Town Council has taken the opportunity to use The Queen's Jubilee to continue its environmental work. Not only planting a ceremonial tree to mark the Jubilee, but also planting trees en masse at Dowd's Farm for The Queen's Green Canopy, ensuring that we retain a commitment to ensuring our area retains its open spaces and diversity."

## NEW SPORTS FACILITIES OPENING

NEW sports facilities, including the area's first full size floodlit 3G football pitch, will open in Hedge End in the Autumn.

The new school facilities include a full size floodlit 3G artificial football pitch, changing facilities and a multi-use activity hall at Deer Park School. Three new football pitches and public open space at the adjacent Berrywood Fields will be the new home for local football club Hedge End Rangers as well as being enjoyed by the local community.

The facilities have been funded by Eastleigh Borough Council from financial contributions made by Hampshire County Council as the master developer of nearby homes, to help provide new community facilities in the area. The facilities have been delivered in partnership with Hampshire County Council and Wildern Academy Trust.

Hedge End Town Councillor and Chair of HEWEB Local Area Committee Cllr. Cynthia Garton said "I'm delighted that these superb new facilities are ready for our community to use. It will provide opportunities for local people to be more active, improve their physical and mental wellbeing as well as encouraging greater social interaction."

Chairman of Hedge End Rangers, Marc Patch said "It's a tremendous facility for all our players, coaches and spectators. We're delighted that the council has shared our vision to encourage local children to come together and be active in friendships and sport."

## BOTLEY BYPASS

THE BOTLEY Bypass works are on-going, managed by Hampshire County Council.

Winchester Road is due to reopen in early September. The new link road diversion will become part of the new bypass on completion of the scheme. The temporary pedestrian crossing will be made permanent.

Construction of the underpass was completed in July. At the time of writing, it was hoped this will allow the temporary loop road to be removed in August with the opening of the new roundabout to improve access to Deer Park School.

Hedge End Town Cllr. Rupert Kyrle said "I am pleased to see progress on this long awaited and badly needed bypass, which I know has been very disruptive to many but, once completed, will bring relief to residents in Botley from heavy and polluting traffic, as well as better access to Deer Park School and the new sports facilities."

# Harvest FESTIVAL

THE HARVEST Festival is a celebration of food grown on the land. It dates back to ancient times when people relied on crops for food and farmers would give thanks for a good harvest.

Celebrated in schools and churches, the festival often involves food being donated for those less fortunate. Here in the UK, it's traditionally celebrated on the Sunday nearest the harvest moon - the full moon which occurs closest to the Autumn equinox. This year the official date for the Harvest Festival is 3rd October although, in practice, celebrations take place at any time during the Autumn.

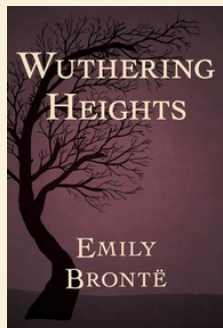

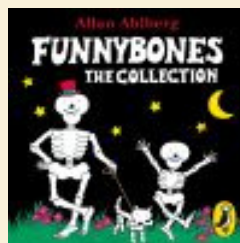

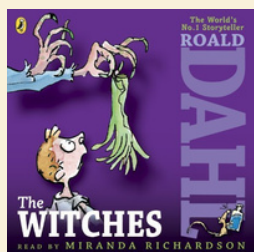
### **Wuthering Heights** by Emily Brontë

One to listen to on Hallowe'en - the story of a brave young boy and his grandmother as they battle England's witches.



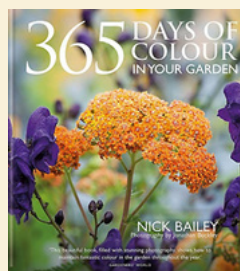
### **The Autumn of the Ace** by Louis De Bernières
