H602 Highway Matters

Councillors raised the following Highway Matters with the Town Clerk to seek resolution:

- Cllr John Shepherd reported the bottom end of Freegrounds Avenue where it joins Bursledon Road there are numerous potholes. Some are considered more than 4cm deep.
- Cllr lan Corben reported the length of Wildern Lane is in such poor condition and needs attention as it is dangerous for drivers and cyclists.
- Cllr Ian Corben also reported that Botley Road is in a similar condition to Wildern Lane which has gone beyond individual potholes.
- Cllr Derek Pretty reported the roundabout at Maunsell/ Tollbar there is a drain that has sunk.
- Cllr Derek Pretty reported that the paving in the surfacing on the roundabout at Burger King is breaking up and the crack is increasing.
- Cllr Derek Pretty reported that the surface on the Bradbeers roundabout is breaking up.
- Cllr John Jupe reported the removal of bollards outside Bet Fred which have been repaired and have sunk.
- Cllr Ron Nichols reported that the road surface is broken up and a danger to people crossing outside costa on Upper Northam Road.
- Cllr Ron Nichols reported that the Barnfield Way bridge is still flooding.
- Cllr Cynthia Garton reported a pothole on Lower Northam Road by the Maypole Roundabout there was a trench which is now sinking.
- Cllr Paul Carnell reported that the keep left sign below Wildern School is missing.
- Cllr Paul Carnell reported a pothole outside No 36 Freegrounds Road.
- Cllr Paul Carnell reported a drain sinking on the corner of Yardley Road/ Freegrounds Road.
- Cllr Paul Carnell reported numerous holes from Heath House Lane to Sherwood Avenue.
- Cllr Carnell reported a large pothole on Heath House Lane Northbound south of Bridleway.
- Cllr Paul Carnell reported numerous potholes near the wall that backs onto Ferndale and near the roundabouts.
