

The work was necessary as the old surface needed repair due to wear and tear. The pool first opened in St John's Recreation Ground in 2002.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all Councillors who give their time voluntarily to serve the communities of Hedge End.



WHEN ROSE Spink founded the Youth Cafe at St Luke's Church seven years ago, she could never have believed how successful it would become.

The retired teacher and her team of 12 volunteers now serve up free food for around 200 school children from Wildern and Deer Park Schools at the church in St Luke's Close every week.

The youngsters can enjoy pizza, toasties, sausage rolls, fruit and Rose's special ice cream milkshake. It's become a place where they can relax together with friends every Thursday after school and, for a few, it may be the only food they get that evening.

Dog Fouling

WE ARE having increasing problems with instances of dog fouling in Hedge End. Whilst most dog owners are caring, responsible individuals, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets.

Earlier this year we were forced to lock the Basketball Court overnight due to the unacceptable and offensive behaviour of people letting their dogs foul in the area. Our staff were having to clean up on a daily basis.

Dog mess is not only unpleasant, it can be dangerous, causing illness in humans. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis — a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice.



Please bag it, bin it!



The Wildern Local Nature Reserve is set in just over 10 hectares of diverse land consisting of woodland, grazing fields, meadowland and ponds. It's owned and managed by Hedge End Town Council supporting local wildlife and biodiversity. The Friends of the Wildern Local Nature Reserve first began recording sightings of wildlife in the area at the start of 2018.

Five years on, member Terry Crow reports on the many inhabitants of this urban reserve.

DOMINATED by woodland, the Wildern Local Nature Reserve is hanging on as a series of valley wetland habitats despite climate change, not least because of a spring-fed stream and the occasional flushes and seepages.

Our largest animals are the Roe Deer (*above*), which have a toe-hold in the Reserve and are one of 12 mammals recorded.





In five years, hundreds of species have been identified and recorded including:

76 different bird species
24 dragonfly species
29 butterfly species
55 bee species
71 wasp species
and over 100 hoverfly species.

Coltsfoot Pond is a nature hotspot - the fish, frogs and invertebrates attract the occasional Kingfisher.



Last May at Wildern Moor I photographed a Winter Damselfly (*right*) an insect of Southern and Central Europe, moving north. This was only the second ever recorded sighting of this species in the UK.

780 invertebrates have been photographed, identified and recorded.



Another such visitor (rare breeder in this instance) is the Red-veined Darter (*below right*). We've been told that the Purple Emperor butterfly (*below left*) photographed in Wildern Moor and Bridget Mary Garden by Andy Binns are the first ever records for Hedge End.

Birds of prey are regular visitors, including buzzards, sparrowhawks and tawny owls with the occasional Peregrine falcons, Red kite, kestrel and one barn owl. The smallest birds are goldcrests and firecrests, both of which breed in our 10 hectare patch. We have spotted flycatchers, little egrets, ravens, nightjar, lesser redpoll, bullfinches, siskins, reed buntings, treecreepers, water rails and a host of avian friends are on our list.



Eels, a critically endangered species, were known to be in Coltsfoot Pond from 2018 but the drought and heatwave of 2022 brought them perilously close to their demise, several in fact so distressed that they died.

Sadly, we appear to have lost grass snakes (*right*), known to have inhabited the area, but we have healthy populations of slow-worms and common lizards on the reptile front.

With over 1,200 wildlife species recorded, we can only show the tip of the iceberg here, missing out many a highlight - not even mentioning the plant and fungi kingdoms. Hopefully, we've given you a flavour of what a small urban reserve is capable of supporting.

Carnival's Crowning Glory!



THIS YEAR'S Hedge End Carnival takes place on Saturday 1st and Sunday 2nd July. For the first time, its hoped there will be a Carnival King and Queen in honour of the King's Coronation.

The Carnival Royalty will be crowned at 2pm on the Saturday, alongside their Prince and Princesses. The Procession begins at 2.15pm at the St John's Recreation Ground to the sound of the Caledonian Pipes. It will move down St John's Road, turning into Freegrounds Avenue, Sherborne Way, Hobb Lane and Lower Northam Road, finishing up in Greta Park where the Gala show will be in full swing having begun at 1pm.

At the Gala event people can enjoy circus shows, dance performances, birds of prey and other acts including Dangerous Steve and Mighty Smith. There will be a variety of stalls including crafts, face painting and a number of charity stalls. Live bands will be performing from 5pm, so why not bring a picnic rug and relax in the park.

Sunday 2nd July is planned to be a chilled day in the park with a variety of stalls and a dog show.

The proceeds from the Carnival Procession will be distributed to local causes in Hedge End.

The Carnival belatedly celebrated its Centenary last year with a big turnout to enjoy the 100 Year Anniversary.

The Carnival Committee also organises a Fireworks Display around Bonfire Night each year.

All profits raised by the Carnival and associated events are donated to local voluntary and charity organisations.

Arts Centre Manager Laura Day said "I'm not sure people realise just how much we have going on here! We are a friendly bunch and love welcoming people of all ages. It doesn't matter if you are already quite skilled or an absolute beginner. It's wonderful to see people discover hidden talents later in life."

The team of professional practitioners and artists lead hour-long, half-day and full-day courses and also offer a full programme of children's school holiday activities and cookery classes.

The centre is passionate about supporting local artists and makers and invites them to display their work in the foyer, sell their pieces or showcase their talent at Open Mic nights. From 19th to 28th August it will be a venue for the Hampshire Open Studios annual art trail event, where people can enjoy free workshops. Partly funded by Eastleigh Borough Council, it has specialist rooms for dance, drama and music and is also home to a number of clubs including the Wave Film Society, Book Club and the Wildern Arts and Leisure Club, with some free to join.

Laura said "We have a coffee shop here which is open every day except Sundays. Why not pop in for a drink and a homemade cake and take a look at what's going on? We're sure we'll have something that you'll absolutely love!"

Centre Stage for 30 Years!


THE PERFORMING Arts Company are celebrating their 30th Anniversary this year.

Back in 1992, Hedge End resident Barbara Fairclough had the idea to put together a youth theatre group to give the young people in the village something to do. Their first performance was West End Story at Wildern School. The group gradually expanded and soon had around 40 members aged from 14 to 30 years, although the upper age limit has now gone as people didn't want to leave!

Barbara said: "It's been the most wonderful 30 years – hard work but magical. We've put on so many different type of shows – pantomimes, plays, murder mysteries, cabarets and musicals. We hope that people have enjoyed coming along to them over the years."

The Company, which rehearses at The Old School House, has presented more than 100 shows, with last year's Cinderella Pantomime enjoyed by more than 600 people across its run. There's been around 800 members of the Company over the years – with roles backstage including helping with scenery and costume-making as well as acting and singing. They are due to perform a 30 Year Celebration Cabaret in June, with plans for Sleeping Beauty in January next year.

Barbara, aged 77, worked in accountancy but has had a love of theatre since she began tap dancing at the age of 2 years. She said "I'm very proud of what we have accomplished. We've helped children gain confidence and believe in themselves and achieve more than they ever thought they could. We'd like to thank everyone who has supported us over the many years!"
