

AS 2023 draws to a close, the Council is looking towards next year, considering the budget requirements whilst taking into account the cost-of-living issues people are experiencing and trying to balance this with the increasing costs the Council is facing.

Like most of you we have seen our energy bills increase twofold which will inevitably have an impact on the Council's budget.

However, despite that, we continue to make good progress on improving standards in our open spaces, in our buildings and in the way we manage our assets such as benches, bins and tree planting.

Autumn through to Spring provided the best opportunities for tree planting and a recent gift of saplings from Woodland Trust will be planted at The Norman Rodaway Sports Ground and Dowd's Park.

Each year we aim to plant native species of both saplings and more mature trees as we inevitably see some trees removed due to disease or damage.

This year has also seen the sowing of Yellow Rattle in some of our open spaces. Yellow Rattle is a parasitic species that attaches to the root systems of several grass species, slowing down their rate of growth, allowing other species to flourish.



And finally, in anticipation of Spring, daffodils have been planted at the Drummond Road Community Centre alongside the fencing and additional ones at St John's Recreation Ground.

That only leaves me to wish you all a Merry Christmas and to remind you of our Christmas Opening Hours on the back page.

OUR GROUNDS Staff have been hard at work trimming back the 4.5km of formal hedgerow we own across the parish. The Town Council has planted a further 3,000 hedging plants since 2019.

This essential maintenance is carried out in the Autumn and Winter once the bird nesting season is over. Hedges provide a natural habitat for wildlife and offer a host of environmental benefits, whilst adding year-round architectural interest.





LIMITED places are available at the Youth Clubs run by our fully qualified DBS approved team at Hedge End Town Council.

Junior Youth Club is open for Year 5 and 6 children living in Hedge End and offers a range of activities including crafts, games, cooking, sports, trips and lots more. The Club meets every Friday from 4.30 until 6pm at the Community Hub in Hedge End. £3 per session. Booking is essential.

The Friday Night Project is an inspiring club for young people with mild or moderate physical or learning difficulties, autistic spectrum condtions or confidence issues living in Hedge End, Botley and West End. Our experienced team supports young people aged 14-20 years to engage in a range of activities, enabling them to reach their full potential in a safe and welcoming environment.

The FNP is by referral only and meets on Fridays from 6.30 until 9pm at the Community Hub. £3.50 per session.

Youth Team Leader David Howse said "We have been supporting our local young people for many years and both the Junior Youth Club and the Friday Night Project offer a safe space to make new friends, try new things and have fun."

Conserving Wildern Moor

WILDERN Local Nature Reserve is a treasure trove of biodiversity nestled within the urban landscape, supporting a range of habitats including woodlands, ponds, streams and the fen meadow (Wildern Moor).

Water-logged and thick with reeds, perennials and grasses, Wildern Moor is an evocative reminder of the extensive wet wildlands that once covered far more of the lowlands than they do today.

Why are fens important? It's the diversity of open pools, wet hollows, tussocky areas, swamps and wet woodland. Around one third of all native plant species and half of our dragonfly species can be found in this type of habitat, together with many other reptiles, amphibians and a vast variety of invertebrates.



Pruning the willows

In the absence of grazing animals, fen meadows require human intervention otherwise over time they will develop into wet woodland as trees gradually take root, stabilising the ground and drawing up the moisture.



Making the dead hedge

Hedge End Conservation Volunteers donned their wellies and braved the Autumn weather to carry out Willow coppicing and sapling removal, helping to manage the encroaching vegetation. The Willows were cut to ground level, and the arisings used to create a dead hedge. Volunteer George explained "The dead hedge is great for biodiversity. Insects love to live and feed on the decomposing wood, and it forms the perfect hideaway for wildlife to nest and forage."

Hedge End Conservation Volunteers are a small but dedicated group organised by Hedge End Town Council. They meet monthly and carry out a variety of conservation tasks across Hedge End on land managed by the Town Council. If you'd like to join, please see our website: www.hedgeend-tc.gov.uk

ALL ABOUT FOOTBALL

Training, Tips and Techniques for Youngsters in Hedge End

AN ENTHUSIASTIC bunch of boys are gathered together for their weekly football training session on a sunny Saturday at Greta Park.

They're part of All About Football T.E.A.M (Together Everybody Achieves More) which was founded by coach Colin Plumhoff 18 months ago.

Colin has been coaching adult football at clubs across Hampshire for years, but it's the impact that he can make on the children with this latest project that he finds most rewarding.

"It's great for the children to come and learn football skills and have fun away from their phones! While some of the children are incredibly talented and might go on to play for local academies, many have never played football before." said Colin.

"We have both girls and boys. Some are shy and nervous about interacting with others and may have learning disabilities, but it's amazing how quickly they start to blossom and come out of their shells."



In hourly sessions from 9am until 12 noon, youngsters aged 5 to 13 years are divided into groups based on their age and taught a range of football techniques and skills, following the all-important warm-up session.

Parent Aaron, whose 7 year old son Reggie has been with the group since the start, said: "He absolutely loves it, it's brilliant. To see him improve at football has been incredible but he's also learned a lot about teamwork and he looks forward to it every week."

All About Football is affiliated to the FA and with Colin's extensive coaching experience he also invites academies to scout for promising players to help them progress in their football career. Colin can also bring training to football clubs or schools.

"Football training is a great way to stay fit and healthy and so it's brilliant to get the children out having fun and socialising," said Colin. "It's so wonderful to see the children flourish and feel a part of something. I honestly couldn't love it more."

Get Up and Go for Winter

How Crafting Can Improve Mental and Physical Health

SOUTHAMPTON QUILTERS member Dee O'Neill says she completely loses track of time when she immerses herself in her sewing.

"Crafting is so good for my mental health. I go into my own little zone with my sewing machine when I'm creating." said Dee.

Southampton Quilters is run by a committee of dedicated quilters. The club started in the city 50 years ago but later moved to Hedge End, where it has existed for as long as anyone can remember.

Crafting, like quilting, is a great way to keep both the mind and hands occupied but there's now more research than ever to show that these activities can have a positive effect on both physical and mental health. The satisfaction of making something can boost self-esteem and improve memory and concentration, whilst the social aspect of joining a club can help combat loneliness.

Southampton Quilters has around 30 members who meet monthly to create impressive wall hangings, blankets, bags, cushions and toys. They also enjoy demonstrations and talks from visiting quilters. The club is open to new members regardless of their sewing experience.

"Quilting is the art of sandwiching wadding between layers," Dee explains. "Some of our members are extremely talented and have been quilting for years, but they love to pass on their knowledge and skills to the newer members who are less experienced, which makes for a lovely, friendly group."

The group is affiliated with The Quilters Guild and is connected to various charities including Project Linus UK through which the members lovingly made quilts and blankets which were donated to children at Southampton Hospital. Quilts have also been given to to the homeless in Southampton and they have auctioned their creations to raise money for the Alzheimer's Society.

Dee, who is also known for her Hedge End Community Sewing Project which raises money for good causes, says "I'd recommend quilting to anyone. I'm a newbie, but once you've mastered the basics, it's truly amazing what you can achieve with a needle and thread. Your own little masterpiece."

Tips for Winter Driving

DRIVING in the winter is very different than in other times of the year. Adverse weather and longer periods of darkness make driving more hazardous. A single journey may take us into very different weather, road and traffic conditions, so here are some tips from the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents for travelling at this time of year.

It's a good idea to have your vehicle fully serviced before the Winter and have the anti-freeze tested. If you can't have it serviced, then do your own checks. In particular, check:



Windscreen, wiper blades and other windows are clean and the washer bottle filled with screen wash.



Lights are clean and working.



Battery is fully charged. Brakes are working well.



Tyre condition, tread depth and pressure



Fluids are kept topped up, especially windscreen wash (to the correct concentration to prevent it freezing), anti-freeze and oil.



Carry an Emergency Kit: RoSPA recommends a tow rope, shovel, boots, hazard warning triangle, de-icing equipment, first aid kit, torch, blanket, warm clothes, emergency rations (including hot drink in a flask) and a fully-charged mobile phone.
